The Marina Keegan Summer Fellowship supports BB&N students interested in pursuing their own projects focusing on either artistic pursuits or activist causes; it honors the memory of Marina Keegan, BB&N Class of 2008, a student noteworthy for her wide-ranging involvement and distinct talents. Winner of the Jacobs Cup, the Profile Prize, the George Henry Browne English Prize, and the Meriwether Otis Kimball Award, she also earned a place in the Cum Laude Society, headed the Model United Nations Club, served as a Peer Counselor, performed in many plays and musicals, sang in the chorale, played four years of varsity lacrosse, wrote for *The Vanguard*, and supported the Gay-Straight Alliance. Additionally, she applied her considerable abilities beyond BB&N's halls to work for political causes and stand up to injustices, both global and individual. In every arena, Marina stood out as a kind, intelligent, invested young woman and a loyal, perceptive friend known for her quick wit and irrepressible energy.
